

1 Introduction to the Panoramic View of the Bible

Below is the Scheme explained on what the colors represent and how to read it

The Colors

Yellow

Glory and Perfection:
4 God, 35 Jesus Christ, 38 Holy Spirit, 5 Creation, 6 Angels, 8 Innocence, 9 Edenic Covenant etc.

Gray

6.1 Satan (see oscillating line), 6.2 Fallen Angels, 10 Temptation Fall, 11 Sin etc.

Brown

Humanity and Nations:
the Dispensations 13 Conscience, 18 Human Government the Covenants 14 Adamic Covenant, 19 Noahic Covenant, 28 Palestinian Covenant, 29 Davidic Covenant, 30 New Covenant
the Nations 33 Time of the World Empires, 50 Roman Empire
the continuous green line in the middle of the Schema stands for Israel in his Land.

Red

Judgments:
15 Expulsion, 17 Flood, 21 Babel, etc

Green

Israel: here to belong
The Dispensations 23 Promise, 26 Law, 57 Kingdom
The Covenants 24 Abrahamic Covenant, 27 Mosaic Covenant, 28 Palestinian Covenant, 29 Davidic Covenant, 30 New Covenant
The continuous green line in the middle of the Schema stands for Israel in his Land.

Blue

Church:
39 Church, 40 Grace, 47.3 Paradise etc.

The Messianic Line

She extends from Adam up to Messiah/Christ; see the brown and green arrows in the middle of the Schema.

The Books of the Bible

They began up to the Theme 47 (grave) and correspond following to the sections of the Table.

47 Place Where the Dead Go

Throughout the Schema are the continued following lines:
47.1 Grave: The brown line stands for the Grave, where all the bodies of the deceased will be.
47.2 Paradise: The blue line stands for the Paradise, where the soul and spirit of the saved believers will be until the first Resurrection.
47.3 Hades: The gray line indicates the place where spirit and soul of the Lost are until the second Resurrection.

The Time/Date Line

The yellow Line below, from Eternity to Eternity, includes the histories dates.
